



Dear Toms River Neighbor,

I am writing to address the issues raised in an anonymous letter you may have received last week from a fictitious organization going by TR Residents Against Overdevelopment, located at the UPS store on Hooper Ave.

First, let me say that if there was such an organization, I, and my fellow Republicans on the Township Council would be card carrying members. Together, we successfully fought to reduce the State/Court mandated affordable housing mandate, getting the demand reduced by almost 50% from 2400 units to 1285. Still too much, we can all agree, but a victory against the Trenton Democrats and the builders' lobby who have no regard for the quality of life in Toms River. Additionally, in partnership with our Freeholder colleagues, we have preserved over 400 acres of Open Space in Toms River during my tenure on the governing body.

Let me be clear. I am absolutely opposed to 2 acre zoning for houses of worship in Toms River. If the U. S. Justice Department demands that we implement such zoning, I will fight them in court. The allegation to the contrary in the anonymous letter is absolutely false.

Since my historic victory in the Republican primary on June 4, my integrity has been under a relentless attack by the Democrats and their fake news flacks. The anonymous letter is part of this vicious attack which I expect will continue through Election Day.

Let me state unequivocally, I have not and would never sell out Toms River to any special interest. That kind of dealing has never been part of my nature.
